# FRIENDS MESSAGE

Grand Forks Public Friends is a group of enthusiastic volunteers that supports the library and its mission by raising funds and promoting library programs and services in the community.

While many of the Friends statistics in 2019 stayed level from the prior year, we realized increases in donations received, library programs impacted, and dollars provided to the library. We know our success was a result of outstanding support from the community, which allowed us to do more for the library! One contributing factor was our participation in the first-ever national #LibraryGivingDay, a one-day fundraising event that gave communities the chance to embrace support of their libraries. We were lucky enough to have a generous community member make an anonymous \$1,500 matching gift.

We would like to highlight two other initiatives from 2019. First, we were able to assist the library by providing funding for ten Early Literacy Outreach Kits for a newly created program. These kits – all of which have a different theme and include books, musical instruments, puppets and more – are used in outreach visits to daycares throughout the county. A library specialist visits and leads a special story time with the kit. The kit can then be left with the daycare to use for the following month until there is a repeat visit. The program has been well received and continues to grow.

Secondly, our Friends focus in 2019 was on Arts in the Library, which was a huge hit! We held ten different programs, classes, concerts and events related to a variety of arts and impacted over 500 library patrons. The splashiest of these events was the Dueling Pianos concert held inside the library. We definitely lived up to our goal of not being a quiet library that night!

Throughout the year, program attendees completed surveys which indicated, in part, that many of them could not have participated in the event if there had been a fee. A large portion of respondents also said that, before attending the event, they didn't realize all of the cool new things the library was doing.

In 2019, our Community Outreach department hosted 102 events, serving 1,930 patrons. Since its inception in mid-2018, the department has formed partnerships with many local organizations by volunteering or working alongside community groups, including:
